a. 42-31619 - Two small flak holes in left elevator, hitting stringers, necessitating change of elevator. Small flak hole through Vertical Fin. Two small flak holes in right side of fuselage.

SUBJECT: Comments of Crews Participating in Mission to Brunswick, 26 April 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, Station 128, APO 557, U. S. Army. (Thru Lt. Col. B. K. Voorhees and Lt. Col. A. C. Brooks).

1. Major Jere W. Maupin, Group Leader, commended the lead navigator of the 94th Combat Wing highly. Major Maupin also was of the opinion that the 457th Group leader did an excellent job of leading the Wing. Major Maupin further stated that our High Squadron flew a very poor formation all day, one difficulty being that the No. 8 aircraft in the High Squadron should have been stacked up and the No. 2 A/C should have been stacked down so that No. 4 A/C could close up properly.

2. Lt. Robert J. Ramsey, TG, A/C 1891, recommends installation of a number of small bandages similar to band-aids in each A/C.

3. T/Sgt. Jack L. Mackey, ROG, A/C 9904, recommends that flimsys be picked up at interrogation.

4. Lt. James V. Walsh, Bombardier, A/C 1077, criticized the fact that the S-2 Briefing Officer mentioned the names of targets of other divisions, and mentioned several cities on route to and in the area of the 401st Group target, during briefing this morning.

5. The gist of complaints concerning the combat mess seem to be that the food is often cold, particularly the bacon, which is also very greasy. The crews do not mind being served with ~~poor~~ ^{poor} ~~messes~~ ^{messes} as long as they are properly prepared and hot. Men making complaints were: Sgt. Scott D. Jones, LRG A/C 2394; Sgt. John A. Gray, ROG A/C 2304, the crew of Lt. Edwin A. Post, Pilot A/C 1077, the crew of Lt. Paul F. Sharp, Pilot A/C 7009, the crew of Lt. Lewis A. Mitchell, Pilot A/C 1619, the crew of Lt. Charles F. Hess, Pilot A/C 1591, the crew of Lt. Dan C. Knight, Pilot A/C 1983.

6. Only criticism of transportation was made by Lt. James G. Levey, Navigator A/C 7084, who stated that only one $\frac{1}{2}$ ton truck was available to haul two crews and that it was not large enough.

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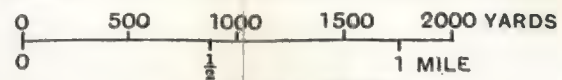

Your target today is one you have visited before. It is a fighter and bombs. etc Assembly factory of a famous producer known as MING. The main MP is a flight hangar located on South end of field. The factory itself is situated on open ground, 1/2 mile North of a West-East running Autobahn, and consists of 3 large assembly shops, two more shops, a gun testing range together with small administrative and general purpose buildings. M-110's are produced here, and possibly other twin-engine types. The fact that we are ^{reportedly} attacking fighter factories and A/C's reveals the strategy for coming events. PRU on 18 April 44 revealed that since our attack of 29 March repairs have been made with the exception of an assembly shop. Also PRU showed 39 A/C on AF 28 of this number were located near the South Hangar.

In event of PFF Palembang your secondary target ~~is~~ is center of town - This city has population of 1296000 - and highly industrialized. Town MP is in the heart of the business section. and South of the MP approximately 2000 yards are your P.T. and additional factories, as well as a large marshalling yard.

Your last resort target is any military objective ^{which is not} that can be bombed without disrupting fighter support.

TAKE-OFF: 0545. 10/10 stratocumulus, base 3-4000', tops 6-7000'. Nil middle and high cloud. Visibility 5 miles.

ROUTE OUT: 10/10 stratocumulus, becoming 6-8/10 just outside the base area, becoming 10/10 at 6 deg. 43 min. E, tops 6-8000'. Nil middle cloud. Nil high cloud, becoming 3-4/10 cirrus at 23,000' at the continental coast, again becoming nil at 5 deg. 4 min. E. Visibility 4-6 miles under the clouds and unlimited above clouds.

TARGET: 1003. 10/10 stratocumulus, tops 6-8000'. Nil middle and high cloud. Visibility unlimited.

ROUTE BACK: 10/10 stratocumulus, tops 6-8000', becoming 6-8/10 at 6 deg. E and 2-3/10 at 5 deg. E, bases 2-3000' over England. Nil middle cloud, except for 20 mile strip of thin altostratus at 7-8000' centered along mid-North Sea. Nil high cloud, becoming 3-4/10 cirrus at Burner Lake, base 23-24,000', again becoming nil over the channel. Visibility unlimited at altitude and 6-10 mi. over England.

BASE ON RETURN: 1340. 2/10 cumulus, base 3000', tops 4000'. Nil middle or high cloud. Visibility 10 miles.

REMARKS: Light, non-persistent contrails at 21,000' over the continental coast on route out and moderate, non-persistent contrails at 18,500 to 19,500' over the continental coast on return. Temperature 5-7 deg. warmer than briefed; temperature at 21,000' was -23. Upper winds: Directions as briefed; velocities 10-20 knots lighter than briefed.
