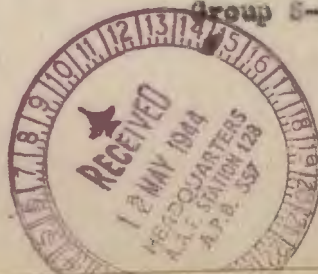
3. The crew of Lt. Edward T. O'Neal, pilot A/C 1005, would like a more complete briefing, particularly concerning target information.

WEATHER INTERROGATION SUMMARY FOR MISSION NO. 1 OF 10 MAY 1944.

BASE ON-TAKE OFF: 0611. Nil low cloud. 8/10 altostratus-alto cumulus middle cloud base 8000' tops 15-16000'. Nil high cloud. Visibility 1/2 miles with haze.

ROUTE OUT: Nil low cloud. 8-9/10 middle cloud tops 15-16000' building and merging with high cloud at English coast. Nil high cloud becoming 8-9/10 bases indefinite tops above 27000' at English coast. Visibility unrestricted at altitude becoming almost nil in haze, contrails, and cloud formation.

RECALL (ENEMY COAST): 0938.

RETURN ROUTE: Reverse of Route Out.

BASE ON RETURN: 0950. Nil low cloud. 10/10 altostratus-alto cumulus middle cloud at 8000' tops 15-16000'. Nil high cloud. Visibility at surface 1/200 yards with haze.

REMARKS: Dense-persistent contrails between 15000' and 27000'. Light rime ice in middle cloud. Temperatures as forecast, e.g., 12000' zero, 27000' -10. Winds more northerly and speeds greater than forecast, e.g., 22000' 290 35. Breaks reported between middle and high cloud near enemy coast; breaks extending from 20-22000' to 21-25000'.
