SUBJECT: Comments of Crews Participating in Mission to HAMBURG, this date.

TO : COMMANDING OFFICER, 401st Bombardment Group (H), APO 557, U. S. Army.
(THRU: Lt. Col. W. T. Seawell and Lt. Col. A. C. Brooks).

1. Major Carl C. Hinkle Jr., Leader of the High Group of the 94th CBW "B" observed that radio discipline throughout the mission was excellent, no violations of radio silence.
2. Capt. Rufus S. Causey, Lead Navigator of the 94th CBW "A", stated that Lt. Col. Ball did an excellent job of leading the 94th "A" CBW.
3. Lt. Irving Weliver, Navigator, A/C 3507, praised the lead navigator of the 94th CBW "B" for his excellent job of leading the box.
4. Lt. Wardlaw M. Hammond, Pilot, A/C 1008, flying with "A" CBW felt that some flak could have been avoided. He stated that the Deputy Lead of this box, who took over in the place of Major White, led the group within the envelope of fire at Heligoland.
5. Lt. Myrick S. Whiting, Navigator, A/C 1008, believes more than one truck should be provided for 5 crews. Lt. Richard H. Hoyt, Co-Pilot, A/C 9993, stated that no truck has been available to haul his crew to interrogation for the last 2 missions. This A/C was in dispersal area #13. The crew of Lt. Russell R. Lockhart, Pilot, A/C 1069, in dispersal area #32, walked to interrogation because truck never showed up.
6. Lt. Russell R. Lockhart, Pilot, A/C 1069, believes a small map showing all hard stands should be given crew members and placed in each truck.
7. The crew of Lt. James F. Risher, Pilot, A/C 7322, wants coffee served at interrogation.
8. Lt. Lawrence E. Fitchett, Pilot, A/C 7511, believes Enlisted Men should be given operational briefing as well as Officers.
9. Lt. Kenneth R. Murgatroyd, Pilot, A/C 1629, observed that A/C flying #3 position in lead squadron of high box in "A" CBW threw out bundled chaff, one bundle penetrating the plexiglass nose of A/C 1629, barely missing the bombardier.
10. S/Sgt Lloyd A. Traux (TTG) A/C 2917, thinks flak helmet should be issued to top turret gunner.
11. S/Sgt John Hafko, RWG, A/C 2917, states that chaff is not bundled properly; with the result that the whole bundle tears open when the string is pulled.

SUBJECT: Abortive Report for missions of 20 June 1944.

TO : Air Statistical Officer, AAF Station 128, APO 557.

1. First Effort.

a. Aircraft 42-37632 returned early because valve was open in fuel line from Tokio Tank, causing fuel to overflow from main tank. It is believed that this valve was accidentally opened during flight, since the overflow would have occurred on the ground had the valve been opened before take-off. (Personnel)

b. Aircraft 42-97487 returned early because of low fuel pressure on one engine (11 lbs.). A ground check revealed an improper installation of the fuel pump, causing a decrease in fuel pressure with an increase in altitude. (Mechanical)

2. Second Effort.

a. Aircraft 42-31077 returned early because Pilot lost formation in the overcast. (Personnel)

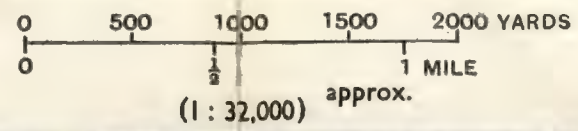

TYPE A

Briefing Notes

The Target is the Construction works (large site) situated on the Southern Edge of the large forest about 11 miles in from Dec Copt. It does not adjoin any built up area but a small village E. N.E. about $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

This is one of the eight "large sites" now identified and was one of the first constructed. It has been bombed and ~~rebuilt~~ many times both by heavy and medium bombardment etc but always rebuilt. The main building (M.R.I) has not. The area is approx 200 x 300 yards, roughly triangular in shape and is built into a hillside.

Secondary and Tact Resort Targets - Any bridge, road center, rail center, troop concentration or other objective of military importance in the movement of ~~the~~ enemy troops not adjacent to a built up area which can be bombed visually.

BASE ON TAKE-OFF: 1740. 7/10 stratocumulus base 2000' tops 3500'. Nil middle or high cloud. Visibility 15 miles.

ROUTE OUT: 6-9/10 stratocumulus tops 3-4000' breaking to Nil-3/10 near 52 North becoming Nil over channel, suddenly increasing to 10/10 at French coast, and breaking to Nil on a line Le Touquet - Ostend. Nil middle cloud. Nil high cloud except 1-3/10 cirrus at 24000' between London and south coast of England. Visibility unlimited aloft.

TARGET: 2031. Nil cloud. Visibilities unrestricted.

RETURN ROUTE: Nil low cloud becoming 10/10 stratocumulus tops 3-4000' 20 miles north of target and persisting for remainder of route. Nil middle or high cloud. Visibility unlimited aloft.

BASE ON RETURN: 2149. 10/10 stratocumulus base 800' tops 3-4000'. Visibility 10 miles.

REMARKS: No contrails or icing. No temperature or wind reports. Deck of North Sea stratocumulus reported east of a line Ipswich - Dover - Le Touquet and north of a line Le Touquet - Ostend.
