ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: BERLIN, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished three 12 A/C squadrons for the 94th "B" Group. Two PFF were included in the lead squadron and 1 PFF in the low ^{and high} squadrons. A spare accompanied each formation.

3. Flight Over England:

a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was made in the darkness before dawn. It was uneventful and all ships took off successfully.

b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Assemblies were also made in darkness. The Squadrons and the Group assembled quickly and departed east of the Cottesmore buncher on time - weather being bad over the buncher.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont'd)

3. c. Route over England:

The route over England was not as briefed because the group had to stay right of course to avoid clouds. To make Division assembly good it had to "S" slightly on the route down to Clacton. Departed CP 1 on course 1 minute late.

4. Attack:a. Flight to Target:

Proper position (#6) was not gained until just before reaching the coast in. A large dogleg had to be made over the channel to effect this. After gaining proper position the group maintained a good Division formation on the way to the target. However, it was necessary to "S" constantly to stay behind 94th "A".

b. Bombing Run:

Lead Squadron: Before we reached the IP the "Mickey" set went out. The Air Commander called and found out that the only "Mickey" working was in the lead of the Low Squadron. Low squadron leader took over lead of Group at the IP. We were to hold our original altitude and go in trail to drop on his smoke marker. We were 600' higher than the low squadron and in trail. We followed them and went through the other smoke markers. There were no openings in the undercast for visual reference points. After we made the turn off the target we called to ask the low why he didn't drop his bombs in order that we could drop on his smoke marker. He replied that he did drop his bombs. We saw neither the smoke marker nor the bombs. If we had known he had dropped, we could have dropped on some other smoke marker, but only through visual flak and D.R. timing did we know where the target city was from the IP. The probable reason for not seeing the smoke marker was due to contrails, reflection of sun, and blinding of the undercast. We finally dropped our bombs on an unknown target of opportunity. Results were unobserved.

Low & High Sqdns: About 10 minutes before we reached the IP the Group Air Commander informed us that we had the only PFF set working and that we would lead the Group in, and the Lead and High Squadrons would drop on us. We took over the Lead, staying at our briefed altitude. The cloud cover was 10/10ths all the way until just over the target where a few breaks were seen but not enough ground was visible for the Bomber to give any assistance to the Mickey man. The Mickey Operator had control all the way on a strictly PFF run. Only a few course corrections were necessary after coming off the IP and rate was pre-set very well. Bombs were salvoed by the low box leader when the indices met. The High squadron leader salvoed on the low; all others used a 140' intervalometer setting. AFCE was okay. Results were unobserved.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Con)4. c. Flight From Target:

After turning off the target 94th "B" could see 94th "A" in front and it got right behind him. 94th "B" stayed in Division formation until the Division break up-point where it separated and started for Cromer.

d. Return to Base:

After the Division break-up the group commenced its let down and went under the clouds at the English coast. Upon reaching Kings Lynn, the lead squadron came to the base the and high and low squadrons went to their "stand off" areas. All A/C landed safely at home base.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as 8/10 undercast through Belgium, strata cumulus clouds with tops at 12-15,000', becoming 9/10-10/10ths over Germany. Slight, non-persistent contrails. Remained about the same on return.

f. Fighter Support:

Excellent. The Group had one ship straggling and as soon as fighter support was requested he had assistance.

g. Comments on Formation:

As far as could be seen the Division and our Group formation was good. Over the target the lead squadron was somewhat to the left of the low squadron which had taken over the lead. Interval and altitude was generally okay.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations: None.5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Lead Squadron: A/C 44-6506 - Not Sortie. Pilot returned due to uncontrollable prop - #4 engine ran hot and #1 engine ran rough.

High Squadron: A/C 43-37602 - Not Sortie. Pilot returned after oil started coming out of breather pipe. Inspection revealed internal failure of #1 engine.

6. Enemy Opposition:

No air opposition was seen or encountered. (See Flak Report for Flak)

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Con)10. Bombing Data:a. Observation:

Lead Squadron: Results were unobserved because of undercast.

High & Low Sqdns: Strike photos show bombfall about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles NE of target - however, it was well within built-up area of city.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron: Of the 12 scheduled A/C, eleven penetrated enemy territory. After low squadron had assumed group lead over target, and lead squadron was unable to see their bombs drop, the lead squadron of 11 A/C attacked an unknown T. of O. at 5300-1315E and dropped 66 X 500# M64 and 44 X 500# M17. Abortive A/C 506 returned 6 GP's and 4 IB's to base. The spare jettisoned 6 GP's and 4 IB's in the channel.

Low Squadron: All 12 A/C E.E.T. attacked the secondary target dropping 70 X 500# M64 and 48 X 500# M17 bombs. A/C 258 had 2 bombs hang up which were jettisoned. The spare returned 6 GP's and 4 IB's to base.

High Squadron: Of the 12 scheduled A/C, 11 attacked the secondary target, dropping 65 X 500# M64 and 44 X 500# M17. One bomb hung up and was jettisoned. Aborting A/C 602 jettisoned 6 GP's and 4 IB's in the channel. The spare returned 6 GP's and 4 IB's.






