ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: RHEINBACH, M/Y, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the 94th "A" Group, comprising three 12 A/C squadrons. One PFF A/C was included in each squadron, and a GH A/C was included in ~~XXXX~~ lead ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ squadrons. A spare accompanied each formation.

3. Flight Over England:
 - a. Takeoff:
As briefed. All A/C ^Took off in normal and satisfactory fashion.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

As briefed, over Cottesmore Buncher at 11,000 feet. Weather was CAVU and assembly was accomplished without difficulty.

c. Route Over England:

The group (94th "A") departed point "Y" ontime, on course. 94th "B" joined 94th "A" near Kings Lynn and the wing departed C P 1 one minute late in proper place in the division column (#9 in division column).

4. Attacks:

a. Flight to Target:

The group passed C P 2, 1 minute late. Due to a wind change the Group drifted south of course. "Buckeye Red" gave the weather over the primary target as 10/10ths and recommended instrument bombing. Four minutes before the IP the group lead was given to the GH ship, which up to that point had been flying no 2 in the lead flight of lead squadron. Bomb bay doors were opened at IP prior to crossing the front lines. The bomb run was 26 minutes long.

b. Bombing Run:

We were flying in the GH ship in the deputy position until 5 minutes before the IP, at which time it was decided that the bomb run would not be made visually, so we took over, to go in on instruments. At the IP the cloud cover was 10/10. As we went along the bomb run the clouds thinned very slightly allowing faint visibility through them, to the ground. About 15 miles before the target a wooded area could be seen distinctly enough to kill the rate. This gave the bombardier only an approximate tangent because we were flying a curved course and still had a few more degrees to turn before the release point was reached. Thus the tangent started with was .45, instead of the pre-determined .54. When the GH navigator did start calling off rate check points to the bombardier the rate turned out to be just right and ended up at .45. The Lead bombardier salvoed when the indices met. The High and Low Squadron Leaders did the same. All others used a 30 ft. intervalometer setting. The AFCE functioned properly. Results were unobserved, but a G-fix taken by the Lead navigator at the point of release, and later plotted, showed results to be approximately on the assigned MPI.

4. c. Flight From Target:

Turning off the target the group had to lose altitude to avoid another group which was on its bomb run to a target east of 94th "A"'s primary target. 94th "A" followed a 4 squadron group from the 3rd Division out of the target area and in doing so went south of briefed course. This was done to stay with this group which had excellent fighter support.

d. Return to Base:

As briefed. After passing 4° E, the division break up point, the group proceeded direct to the wing cross-in point. 94th "B" bombed the secondary target and did not fly with 94th "A" from the target.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as varied, from 3/10 to 10/10 stratus cloud, solid from ground to 1 - 2,000 feet. Target was completely overcast.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was adequate.

g. Comments on Formation:

Good most of the mission, with the formation being excellent the latter part of the bomb run.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast results were not observed--however, thought to be within target area.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

Of the 12 A/C EET, ten attacked the secondary target, dropping 178 X 250# M57 and 20 X 500# M17 bombs. Two other A/C bombed other targets. A/C 8788 dropped 18 GP's and 2 IB's on a T/O at 5023-0536#
 A/C 7664 dropped 18 GP's and 2 IB's on a T/O at 5032-0705E
 The spare returned 18 GP's and 2 IB's to base.

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 215 X 250# M57 and 24 X 500# M17 bombs. The spare returned 18 GP's and 2 IB's to base.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 215 X 250# M57 and 20 X 500# M17 bombs. The spare returned 18 GP's and 2 IB's to base.

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





SUBJECT: Crew Comments and Suggestions on Mission to GEROLSTEIN, GERMANY.
TO : Commanding Officer, Station 128, APO 557, U.S. Army.

1. Major Alvah H. Chapman, Group Leader, wished to commend the Lead and Low Squadron airplane commanders for the excellent formation they maintained on the bomb run.
2. Major Chapman also stated that, at engine time, no jack-box had yet been installed in the Co-Pilot's position, and that before one could be secured and installed, his crew was late starting engines and preparing for take-off. Also according to Major Chapman, the type of frost-killer which was used on the windshield of A/C 7636 created a film on the windshield which restricted visibility almost entirely. He recommended that crew-chiefs be advised to wipe windshields well before the A/C takes off.
3. Some crew-members were of the opinion that the haze and fog conditions at base were such as to have warranted the formation being diverted to land at another airdrome.
4. Lt. Myron L. King, Pilot A/C 6508, reported that all windows in this A/C were very dirty and stated that his crew cleaned them as best they could by sticking their arms out of the windows after the A/C was airborne.
5. Lt. Herman Fausig, Pilot A/C 2607, reports that the toilet in the 612th and 613th Equipment building is in a very unsanitary condition.
6. Lt. Audrey J. Bradley, Pilot A/C 6513, was critical of what he called the "poor assembly" of the Group.
